Spruce Wilderness Lodge Directions Sheet

Please print this off and bring it with you. There is no cellular service once you reach the forest service roads. GPS and Google are not reliable for an accurate and safe route.

Directions from Kamloops via Westsyde Road/Jaimeson Creek Forest Service Road

- Take the Hwy 5 North exit #374 Jasper
- On Hwy 5 turn left on the Halston Connector/Paul Lake Rd
- Stay to the Right and follow the signs to Westsyde Rd
- Turn right on Westsyde Rd (North) for 21 KM
- At 20.5 KM there is a sign for logging trucks entering the roadway
- 60 meters after the sign is the entrance for the Jamieson Forest Service Rd on the left side take this road (You will see our Spruce Wilderness Lodge sign)
- At 28.9 KM on Jamieson go straight up the hill
- Part way up the hill you will see the 30 KM marker
- At 36 KM stay to the right
- 48.6 KM stay to the left
- 51 KM stay to the Right
- Just after 55 KM marker turn right onto Bonaparte Hills Forestry Rd
- Follow this for 2.5 km to the Resort entrance on the left

Directions from Hwy 5 via Darlington Creek Forest Service Road

- Travel on HWY 5 approximately 14km North of Barriere or 14-15 km South of Little Fort.
- On the West side of HWY #5 is the Rainer Custom Cutting sign. This is the Darlington Creek Forest Service Road.
- Follow Darlington Creek FSR for 16km and turn left which is clearly marked the Powder Lake Forest Service Road.
- Continue on the Powder Lake FSR for 13km until you reach the Jamieson Creek FSR at km 48.8.
- Turn right on the Jamieson Creek FSR and Drive to km 55.
- Just after the km 55 marker turn right on the Bonaparte Hills FSR. and drive 2.5 km to the Resort entrance on the left.

Important Notes

- Be sure you have adequate fuel before leaving town. There are gas stations on Westsyde Rd, Hwy 5 in Barrier and Hwy 5 in Little Fort. All an hour or more from the Resort.
- You will be travelling on a gravel road for 40-60km depending on which route you take. Please be sure that your spare tire is accessible and in good condition and that you have the appropriate tools to change a flat tire.
- Drive with caution for logging trucks, wildlife and other road users.
- It is a good idea to use the trip odometer to track your travelled km's once you hit the gravel road. You will know quickly if you have missed a turn when you have travelled in excess of the stated kms in the directions above.

Please plan to arrive before dusk. This will make seeing the km markers and signs much easier. As well once you arrive at the resort you will be able to drive to your cabin to unload and then park in the parking lot. There is no parking of vehicles/trailers and ATV's/Dirtbikes/side-by-sides at the cabins and chalets.

Do not unload your off road vehicles from trailers at the cabins. No exceptions.

- Please plan your arrival before dusk.
- There is No Check In after 10PM.
- The gate hours are 8AM to 10PM.

Parking

- Any and all motorized vehicles are to be parked in the parking lot.
- There is no access to cabins and chalets via ATV's/Dirtbikes/Side-by-Side's
- You can only drive your vehicle to your accommodations to unload or load upon arrival and departure.
- Do Not unload your ATV/Dirtbike/Side-by-Side from your truck/trailer at your accommodation. It must be unloaded in the parking lot only.
- Tow vehicles must be unhooked from Trailers/Campers and be parked in the parking lot. In-box truck campers and guests camping in tents are allowed 1 vehicle in their campsite. There no in and out privileges for the campsite vehicles.

Generator power

- The resort electricity is run solely by diesel generator.
- Generator hours are 7AM-10AM and 6PM to 10PM.
- All cabins, wash house & chalets have electric lights.
- Cabins have electric fridges
- Chalets water pump is electric.

Propane appliances

- All accommodations have propane stove tops and propane BBQ's.
- Wash house and Chalets have propane hot water tanks.
- The chalets and cabin 5 have propane fridges.
- The chalets have propane wall lanterns.

Water

- Cabins and Wash house are on a treated lake water system. It is advised that you boil the this water before drinking or cooking with.
- The lake water is pumped to an above ground cistern and gravity fed. There is only cold running water in the cabins from May to October. After October there is no running water in the cabins or wash house.
- Chalets are on a potable well water system.
- Chalets have running hot and cold water all year.

Wood Stoves

• All accommodations are heated with wood stoves. Firewood is included in the cost of your stay.
